What is autism spectrum disorder (ASD)? ASD, sometimes called autism, is a complicated disorder that affects how a person experiences and processes their thoughts, feelings and environment. ASD is a neurodevelopmental disorder, which means that it often appears early in life, such as when you are a baby or child (when your brain is still developing).

Understanding autism spectrum disorder

In the current revised version of the DSM (the DSM-5), these separate conditions have been combined into one diagnosis called "autism spectrum disorder." Using the DSM-5, for example, people who were previously diagnosed as having Asperger's syndrome would now be diagnosed as having autism spectrum disorder. Although the "official" diagnosis of ASD has changed, there is nothing wrong with continuing to use terms such as Asperger's syndrome to describe oneself or to identify with ...
