But, I can't not share my ardent admiration of Divya, the sensational Glitch streamer in the center of Eric Smith's spectacular Realistic-Fiction-YA, *Don't Read the Comments*. Initially, I find it incredibly cool that this high-school student enjoys playing almost as much as she treasures the comfort and camaraderie ...
